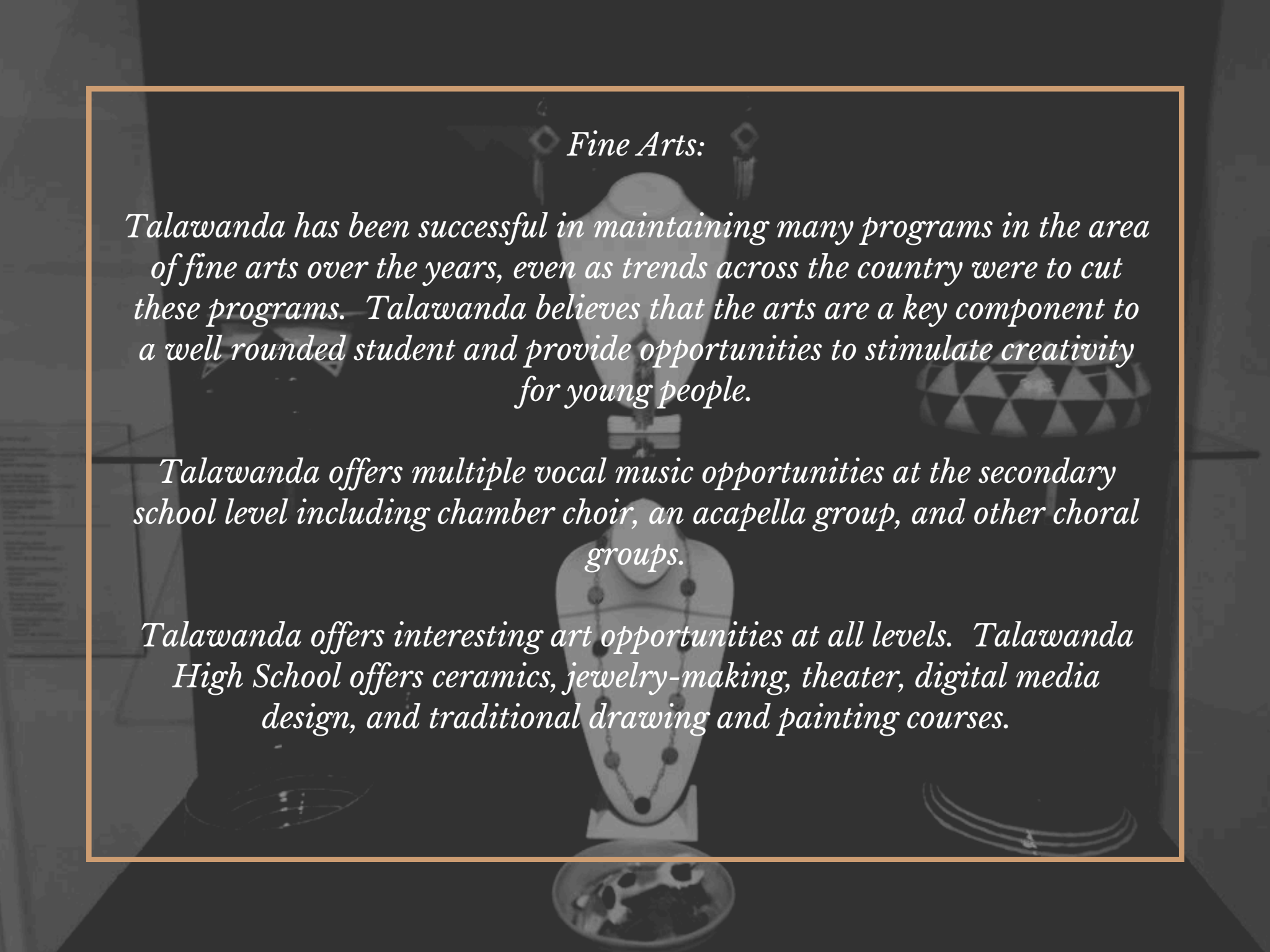
Academics:

Talawanda averages 250-270 graduates each year!

Talawanda High School offers 2 world language courses, 18 honors courses, and 13 AP courses. We have 70 certified high school teachers with a student to teacher ratio of 14:1, with 3 school counselors, and 3 administrators.

Many students take advantage of Ohio's College Credit Plus Program.

68% of our graduates seek a higher level of education and training in either a 4 year or 2 year institution or a technical college. 3% of our students went into military service last year, and 28% went straight to the job market.

Talawanda has been successful in maintaining many programs in the area of fine arts over the years, even as trends across the country were to cut these programs. Talawanda offers interesting art opportunities at all levels. Talawanda High School offers ceramics, jewelry-making, theater, digital media design, and traditional drawing and painting courses.

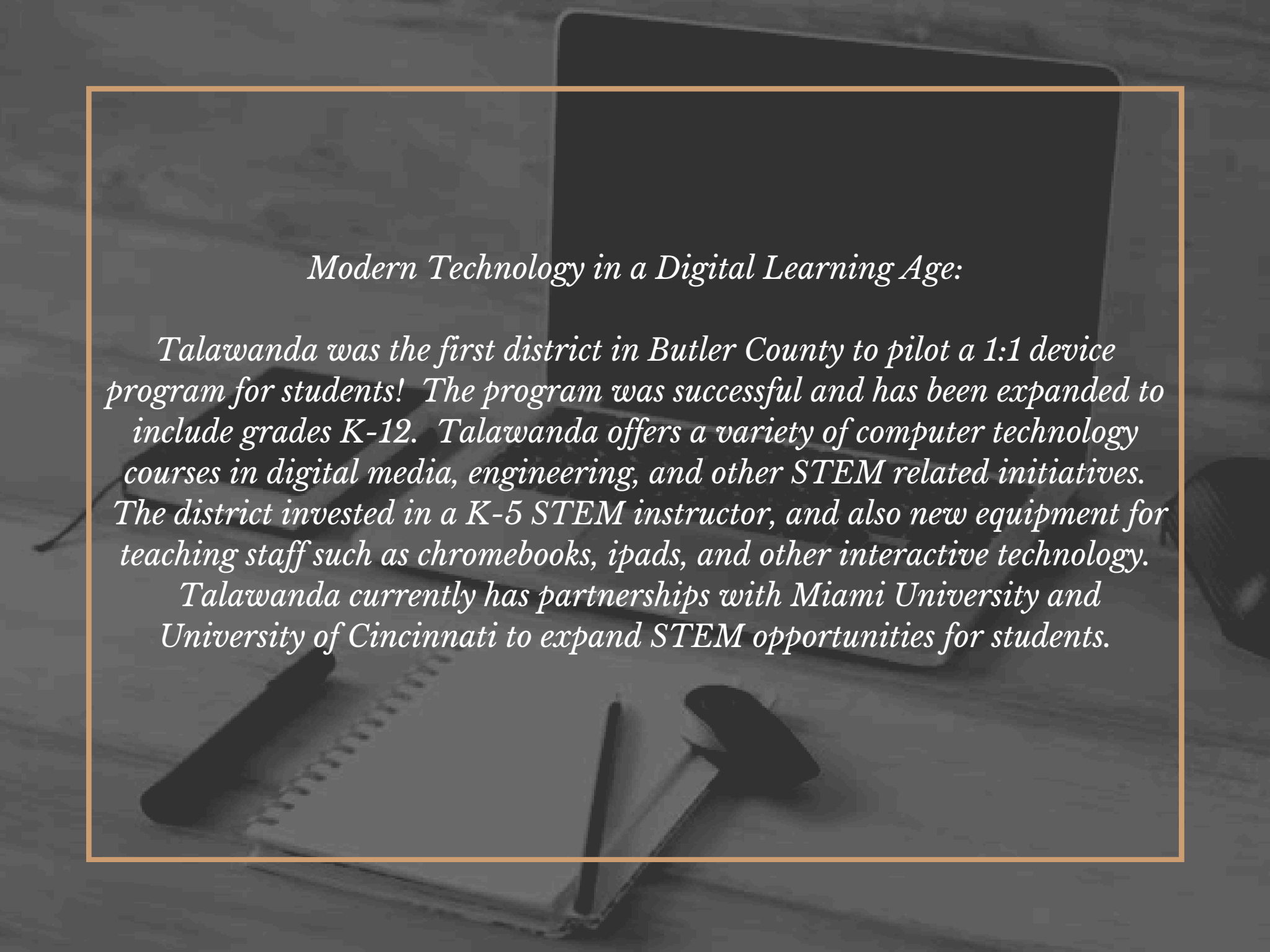

Talawanda is Committed to Growth & Improvement:

Talawanda believes that better data collection from students, staff, and families produce better results. It is important for the district to have credible information about the effectiveness of school programs. The district regularly conducts surveys regarding student, parent and teacher satisfaction. Talawanda consistently has very high satisfaction rates in the areas of student safety, and equitable and fair treatment of students and parents. In addition, the superintendent hosts student, parent, and community focus groups to help share information in person, but also to gather informal feedback about how well Talawanda is doing in terms of understanding the values of the community and meeting their needs. Talawanda is planning a new student ambassador program to welcome new families to our schools and community. This new program is a direct result of working with community members and trying to meet their expectations for creating a welcoming school environment.

Modern Technology in a Digital Learning Age:

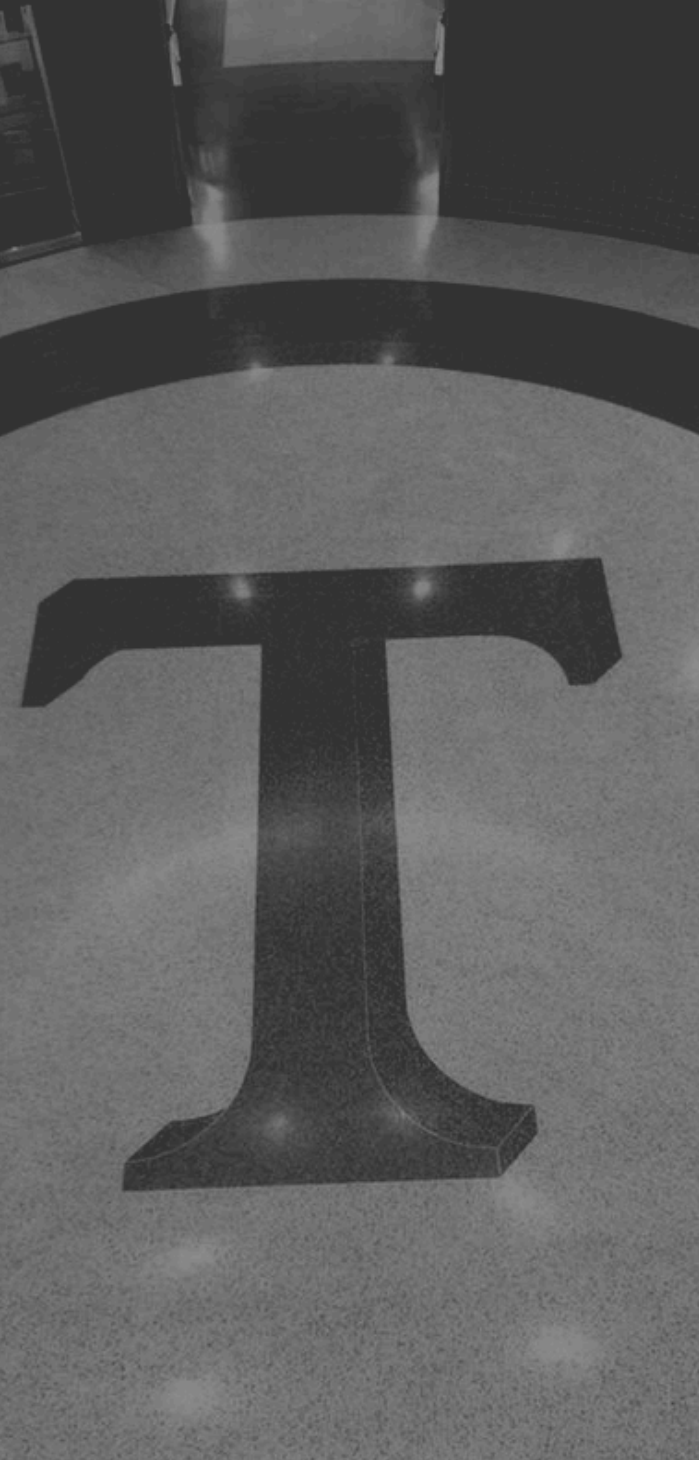
Talawanda was the first district in Butler County to pilot a 1:1 device program for students! The program was successful and has been expanded to include grades K-12. Talawanda offers a variety of computer technology courses in digital media, engineering, and other STEM related initiatives. The district invested in a K-5 STEM instructor, and also new equipment for teaching staff such as chromebooks, ipads, and other interactive technology.

Talawanda currently has partnerships with Miami University and University of Cincinnati to expand STEM opportunities for students.

Fiscal Stewardship:

Responsible financial planning ensures that the majority of funding is spent on classroom instruction.

Talawanda has won the Auditor of State Award for fiscal responsibility. The cost per pupil in Talawanda Schools is \$12,208. Talawanda approved a Master Facilities Plan in 2001. The Ohio School Facilities Commission (OSFCC) has deemed that 24% of the total cost of the plan will be reimbursed to Talawanda. A portion of the funds were already made available with the construction of a new Kramer Elementary. The district just completed a the OSFCC project to replace Marshall Elementary. Talawanda School District has not had to ask the community for a bond issue since 2008, when the community approved a bond issue to build the new Talawanda High School. Talawanda students need modern facilities equipped with modern science labs and technology for the education required for today and the future.
