TMS PTG Donation Drive Results

The 2017-18 TMS PTG Donation drive was a big success. We almost doubled the number of donations from last year, and raised just over \$625.00. Destination ImagiNatiOn is an innovative creative problem-solving program for participants from kindergarten through high school. Teams of 5 to 7 participants are challenged to solve one of five unique Team Challenges and an Instant Challenge with no adult assistance. Each of the five Challenges offers participants an opportunity to explore art, literature, drama, engineering, architecture, and improvisation.

Our regional tournament will be held in March at Miami University. Teams forming will require a parent or other adult that is willing to volunteer their time to be a team manager. Free Manager/Coach training sessions are available in the fall.
