Introduction

This booklet has been prepared for the students of Talawanda High School and includes information regarding local scholarship opportunities for post secondary education & training.

Each Scholarship requires a completed Talawanda Application as well as a copy of the student's THS Transcript. Duplicate copies may be required.

Read each scholarship description carefully. Some scholarships require additional information such as another application and/or letters of recommendation.

Criteria may include but are not limited to:

- Plans of post-secondary education
 - Scholastic Achievement
 - Academic promise
 - Financial Need
- School and/or Community Service
 - Extracurricular Activities
 - Recommendations
 - Transcripts
 - Leadership Abilities
 - GPA
 - ACT/SAT Scores
 - Interviews
 - Essay
 - Motivation/Character

Institutions of higher learning control more money than any other resource facility. It is recommended that students seeking financial assistance contact the Financial Aid Office at the institution they plan to attend for additional assistance. Often this is done at the same time an application for attendance is completed.

Additional scholarship opportunities are posted on the THS Counseling website as information is received. Seniors should check the website for these opportunities.

All forms & required documents must be returned to the Guidance Office by 3:00 PM on February 23, 2024. No late applications will be accepted.

Dr. Mark Mortine Scholarship

The Dr. Mark Mortine Scholarship is given in honor of his 35 years of dedicated service to Talawanda School District as a teacher and administrator.

<u>Eligibility</u>

- Graduating Senior.
- Minimum 3.0 GPA overall and a minimum 3.5 GPA during the student's Junior and Senior years combined.

Basis for Award

- Primary consideration for students who intend to major in Education.
- Secondary consideration for students who intend to major in another helping profession.
- Demonstrated history of volunteer work.
- Preference for students who have taken three or more years of a high school foreign language.
- Financial Need.

Application Procedure

- Minimum 500-word typed essay. This essay must describe the student's career goals and motivating factors behind those goals.
- Two letters of recommendation from non-family members. One letter must be from a current or former Talawanda Staff Member.
- Transcript
- Completed 2024 THS Scholarship Application form.

Amount Awarded

• One (1) \$500 non-renewable scholarship.

Oxford Kiwanis/Amy Wengler/Key Club Community Service Award

Donations in memory of Amy Wengler to the Talawanda Key CLub are used to offer this award.

<u>Eligibility</u>

• Open to graduating Seniors who have demonstrated exceptional effort in providing community service.

Basis for Award

• Students must submit a list of at least 5 community service activities or at least 25 hours of community service during Junior and Senior years, including Summer. Documentation of service must be provided.

Amount Awarded

• \$500

Oxford Area PFLAG Diversity & Inclusion Scholarship

This scholarship aims to recognize a graduating Talawanda Senior who has demonstrated a commitment to embracing diversity and championing inclusion during their time as a student. We conceive of diversity as difference in all forms: financial, religious, gender identification, sexual preference, racial and ethnic identity and physical abilities. Applicants

may identify as a member or an ally or both, of any groups lending diversity to the public-school experience at Talawanda.

<u>Eligibility</u>

- Graduating Senior who plans to attend a college, university or trade school degree / certificate program beginning in Fall of 2024.
- Student with a GPA of 3.25 or higher.
- Application and Essay completely submitted.

<u>Basis</u>

• Scholarships will be awarded on academic promise, recommendation letter from teacher or community member and a personal essay.

Amount Awarded

• A one-time award for \$500 will be paid directly to the recipient.

Oxford Masonic Lodge #67 Free and Accepted Masons W. Mark Sheard Memorial Scholarship

The Oxford Masonic Lodge No. 67, F.&A.M., Mark W. Sheard Memorial College Scholarships are competitive scholarships that may be awarded annually either to Talawanda High School graduates, or to children of members in good standing of Oxford Lodge No. 67, F.&A.M. The following scholarships are available: (1) one to a graduating high school senior (graduating in 2024); a second to a sophomore college student, a third to a junior college student, and a fourth to a college senior. Hence in 2024 four scholarships may be offered.

<u>Eligibility</u>

- Must be a graduating high school student, or be a continuing college student as described below.
- Applicants must be of good moral character, exemplify good citizenship and must provide evidence of personal involvement in school and/or college activities, and participate in community service type projects that are indicative of good citizenship.
- Applicants must be pursuing further formal education at a technical school, or a two or a four-year college.
- Students selected for a scholarship one year may re-apply for the following academic year (up to a maximum of 4 years of scholarship support) provided they remain in good academic standing (i.e., not on probation for any reason), are making good progress toward graduation, and meet the relevant requirements listed below.

<u>Requirements</u>

• For 1st Year Scholarship (for a graduating high school student): A. Three (3) letters of recommendation: One from a high school teacher, one from a community or school leader/advisor (e.g., 4-H Club or FFA advisor), and one (1) from a minister or pastor.

B. The applicant must write an essay of approximately 1000 words on the general subject of "Freemasonry and the Founding Fathers of the United States"; the essay must be typed and doubled spaced.

- For Continuing College Students (students who have previously received one of our scholarships); MUST provide the following:
 - A. Evidence of good academic standing as indicated by a copy of the student's college transcript.
 - B. A letter of recommendation from the students college advisor
 - C. Evidence of continued involvement in community service type activities.

- College students applying for one of our scholarships for the first time:
 - College students who are applying for the first time to our scholarship program must complete items 2 A, B, and C above, and must also write an essay as described above for first time applicants and also have a letter of recommendation sent from their minister or pastor.

Letters of Recommendation

• These should address character, academic, motivation, and contributions as a good citizen as well as other pertinent information.

Selection of Scholarship Applicants

• The Board of Directors of the Temple Board, Oxford Masonic Lodge No. 67, F&AM is responsible for the evaluation of applications and the selection of scholarship awardees.

Amount To Be Awarded

• Each scholarship is for \$2000, payable to the recipient's chosen school by the Treasurer of the Oxford Lodge #67 Masonic Temple Association, Box 88, Oxford, OH 45056 upon verification of the recipient's acceptance and/or continued enrollment by the college or university.

PEO Chapter CB Marguerite Scholarship

P.E.O. is a philanthropic organization where women celebrate the advancement of women; educate women through scholarships, grants, awards, loans and stewardship of Cottey

College; and motivate women to achieve their highest aspirations. A committee of members of Chapter CB will review the candidates and use a matrix of the following criteria along with a holistic review of the application to award this scholarship.

<u>Eligibility</u>

- Female Senior
- Plans to continue education at a junior college, college, university or vocational school

Basis For The Award

- Student's academic record including GPA, Class Rank and Test Scores.
- Brief statement explaining future educational plans.
- Leadership in organizations and participation.
- Service to school and/or community.
- Financial Need

The Talawanda Bantam Football and Cheerleading Scholarship

Basis For The Award

- Transcript

- Completion of additional application

• Two (2) \$500.00 Scholarships. One Football Participant and One Cheerleading Participant.

Oxford Seniors Scholarship

Presented by Oxford Seniors to encourage and aid a student who needs financial assistance to continue their education.

<u>Eligibility</u>

- Student must be a current Senior.
- Must be planning to attend an institution of higher education.
- Prefer applicants who have verifiable experience working with older adults. (55+)

Basis for Award

- Academic Record & Promise
- Community Service
- Financial Need

Application Procedure

- Minimum 500 word typed personal essay on your personal experience with older adults
- One (1) reference letter
- THS Transcript
- 2024 THS Scholarship Application
- <u>Amount To Be Awarded</u>
 - \$1,000.00

The Talawanda Educators Association Scholarship

Sponsored by the Talawanda Educators Association. A minimum of one scholarship per year will be awarded.

<u>Eligibility</u>

- Must be a graduating THS Senior
- Preference will be given to those who are pursuing a degree in the field of Education
- 2.5 GPA or higher

Basis For The Award

- Character and Service
- Two letters of recommendation one must be from someone **not** currently employed by Talawanda City School District
- One 250 to 300 word essay describing your plans for the future and how you feel you will utilize the scholarship
- THS Transcript

<u>Amount To Be Awarded</u>

• \$1,000 non renewable scholarship.

The Talawanda Educators Association - Jane B. Salmon Scholarship

Sponsored by the Talawanda Educators Association, family and friends in honor of Jane B. Salmon, former Talawanda teacher.

<u>Eligibility</u>

- Graduating THS Senior
- Student must either:
 - Plan to pursue a degree in a helping profession such as nursing or teaching.
 - Pursuing a degree with a major in Special Education
 - A current or former learning disability student who is or has been enrolled in a disabilities class or has been served by an LD tutor who is planning to pursue additional training or education and must be accepted into an institution for further education or training.

- Character
- Two letters of recommendation
- Financial Need

• Minimum of \$500.00

The Tyler Richardson Foundation Scholarship

<u>Eligibility</u>

- Must be a graduating THS Senior
- 3.0 GPA or higher
- Planning to attend a college, trade school, university, or vocational/technical school

Basis for the Award

- Overcoming some type of adversity
- Essay
- Letters of Reference

Application Procedure

- Minimum 500-word typed essay on how you have overcome adversity/obstacles in your life.
- Two letters of recommendation from non-family members at least one must be a current or former Talawanda staff member.
- THS Transcript must be included.
- Complete application.

Amount To Be Awarded

• . The committee will determine the exact amount based on eligibility. A minimum of \$250.00 will be awarded to each recipient.

The Marvin & Janet Wilhelm Scholarship

A scholarship honoring Marvin, a former Talawanda Principal, and his wife Janet Wilhelm.

<u>Eligibility</u>

- Graduating THS Senior
- Plans to attend a four year college majoring in a helping profession.

Basis for Award

• Exhibits willingness to help people by having volunteered their time throughout the year.

- Please include a short narrative that addresses your goals for the future and why you believe you should be considered for this scholarship.
- Please include two (2) letters of recommendation.

<u>Eligibility</u>

- Current THS and Butler Tech Senior Student Athletes.
- The award will be extended to a deserving Talawanda or Butler Tech student athlete who will be pursuing post-secondary education at an accredited 4-year, 2-year or technical college.

Amount To Be Awarded

• The award of \$500 is to be used for expenses related to educational needs. <u>Application Procedure</u>
