ACHIEVEMENT -

The Achievement component represents whether student performance on state tests met established thresholds and how well students performed on tests overall. This component measures the achievement of every student, not only those who reach proficient.



GRADUATION -

Four-year adjusted cohort graduation rate is calculated by dividing the number of students who graduate in four years or less with a regular or honors diploma by the number of students who form the final adjusted cohort for the graduating class.



EARLY LITERACY-

The early literacy component measures reading improvement and proficiency for students in kindergarten through third grade. This component includes three different unrated measures; proficiency in third grade reading, promotion to fourth arade, and improvina K-3 literacy.



The gap closing component shows how well we are meeting the performance expectations for our students in English language arts, math, and graduation. It also measures how we are supporting English learners to increase language proficiency, reducing chronic absenteeism for all students, and identifying gifted students and providing affetd services.



COLLEGE, CAREER, WORKFORCE & MILITARY READINESS

The college, career, workforce, and military readiness component measures how well-prepared Ohio's students are for all future opportunities. This component will not be rated and will not factor into the overall rating until the 2024–2025 school year at the earliest.
