Why Choose Miami CCP?

Benefits

- We have a long history of providing high school students the opportunity to earn college credit through PSEO and dual credit.
- Many courses available in both seated and online formats.
- Fit online and evening courses easily into your high school schedule and activities.
- Interact with Miami professors and students in a university environment.
- Complete courses not available at your high school.
- Seamlessly transition credits to any one of Miami's three campuses (Oxford admission standards apply).
- · Free tutoring and academic support.

Why Choose Miami CCP?

Cautions

- College classes can be more intense with a heavier workload; for a 3 credit course, expect to spend
 6-9 hours outside of class meetings doing related work.
- Pace of college classes may seem faster than high school pace with fewer college class meetings.
- College age students and course subject matter.
- College calendar may conflict with school district calendar.
- College class times can interfere with high/middle school activities.
- College GPA begins with CCP coursework; CCP coursework can be considered when determining "satisfactory academic progress" for financial aid consideration.
- If students fully matriculate at Miami University, their CCP coursework counts in their GPA.
- Fail a course, and the school district or state can require you to pay the cost of the course.
- Fail a course, and you cannot repeat the course through CCP.

Miami University Oxford Campus CCP Options



- Choose from online or seated Miami University Oxford-based courses taught by Miami faculty.
- Use a 15 credit or 30 credit academic pathway to help guide your choices.
- Complete Ohio Transfer Module (OTM) and Transfer Assurance Guide (TAG) courses that are guaranteed to transfer to any Ohio public college or university.



How to Apply for CCP at Miami's Oxford Campus

- CCP students must apply to the program each academic year they wish to participate.
- Homeschooled and private school students must apply by the April 1 deadline to meet possible state funding requirements.

Request and send the following to the Miami University-Oxford Campus Office of Admission:

- CCP application for admission (Public High School).
 - Deadline to apply for 2017-2018 academic year: May 1, 2017.
 - Deadline for Spring 2018 semester only: November 1, 2017.
- Official high school transcripts or middle school grade report.
- Official ACT/SAT test scores.
 - Miami's ACT code is 3294; the SAT code is 1463.
- Letter of recommendation.
- School verification form.

Admission Requirements for CCP at the Oxford Campus

- A minimum composite ACT score of 25 or a minimum Old SAT score (CR + Math) of 1130 or a minimum New SAT (ERW + M) of 1200.
- A cumulative GPA of at least 3.50 on a 4.00 scale.
- A written letter of recommendation indicating the student demonstrates the academic ability and emotional maturity to successfully participate in college classes.
- School Verification form indicating student is eligible to participate.
- All data shall be considered that may be an indicator of college readiness.

Advising and Support Services



- Upon acceptance into CCP, students will attend a mandatory advising and orientation/registration program.
- Important deadlines for registration and course withdrawals will be communicated both to the student and to the high school/middle school counselor.
- Each CCP student will be assigned an advisor at Miami and will meet at least once prior to the date on which a withdrawal from a course would negatively affect a student's transcripted grade.
- The CCP student who follows a particular academic pathway might also meet with a faculty advisor in that discipline.

Oxford Campus Timeline



- Notify your school district of your intent to participate in CCP by February 15.
- Complete a Miami University, Oxford Campus CCP application by May 1 for fall consideration and November 1 for spring (Public High School).
- Attend a CCP orientation, advising, and registration program.

Who is eligible for CCP at Miami Regionals?



- Fall 2017: Students must submit ACT or SAT scores to determine college readiness.
- CCP College Readiness:
 - ACT subscores in English ≥18 and Reading ≥22
 - SAT Verbal 480+
- Once college readiness had been established (reading & English), students will be notified of their full admission into CCP and of their next steps in the orientation and registration process.
