


## State Budget Process

- Due June 30th
- 2 Year Budget
- House and Senate Make their Individual Versions
- Once Passed by House and Senate, Governor Signs
- During the Process (Goes Back and Forth)
- Items are Changed, Deleted, Added Throughout Process
- Remember: Anything Can Change Until the Budget is Signed

### How a Bill Becomes a Law

- Bill Introduced
- Committee
- Hearings (Changes Made
- Debate
- Filibuster possible in Senate (delay tactic)
- Vôte
- Sent to Governor
- Sian Bill
- Veto both houses can vote to override with 2/3 vote
- Not sign bill & after 15 days becomes law

## **Funding Formula-Fair School Funding Plan**



# K-12 FSFF


The State of Ohio funds public schools based on a funding formula that is developed by Ohio's Governor along with the Ohio House and Senate. The funding formula is often subject to significant changes every two years because the formula itself is a component of Ohio's 2-year biennium budgeting process.

The state funding formula that is in current law is called the Fair School Funding Formula. We are in the 4th year of this formula phase in, with year 5 and 6 being debated by the House & Senate right now. If approved:

- FY26 would be 83% phased in, with FY27 being 100%; but...
  - Base Costs Inputs will use FY22 levels
  - Local Capacity Inputs will use FY24 levels
- Phase out of the 'Guarantee' Programs

- All funding formulas developed by state law are created with the basic understanding that state funding is partially funded by the State of OH, but requires a portion of the funding provided by the State of OH to be paid for by the school district itself = LOCAL SHARE.
- Local share calculation relies on a combination of:
  - Property Values, Taxpayer Income + Enrollment
  - If local share increases/decreases at a faster/slower pace than state-wide cost factors, then state funding at the district level can be positively or adversely impacted



- Average Annual Growth Rate in Revenue from the State of OH .17%
- State Share Index has decreased from just over 26% to 13.7%
- FY08 TSD received \$8.7M; in FY24 TSD received \$8.8M in State Aid
- TSD Enrollment in FY08 was 2,846, in FY24 Enrollment was 2,739

# 26/27 Biennium Budget Bill Issues

### **HB96: Biennial Budget (as Introduced)**

- Unused district buildings for instructional purposes by minimum 60%.
  - Offer to community school within district, then charter school outside district, then boarding school and STEM schools
- Use updated local capacity data (property and income data) but keep base cost inputs at FY22 levels.
  - Expenditure CPI 3.5% and higher since 2022
- Phase out of the guarantee structure
  - 5% in FY26, 10% in FY27 (loss of \$330K)

### SB66 - Modifications to the 20-mill Floor Calculations


• SDIT would be pulled into the calculations: how will the County formulate the calculations? If when originally voted in, could lose \$3M+ annually

### SB116 - Reduces pipeline valuation from 88% to 25%

Rockies Pipeline Express is within our boundaries

### Total Estimated Annual Revenue (Loss) on the line for TSD: \$3.9M



## What Should I Address When Contacting Legislators?

- Your Personal Story Regarding Talawanda and your experience
- One of the largest geographic areas (144 square miles)
- Guarantee makes up \$2.2 million dollars per year
- State Share even with Fair School funding Model is low (approx. \$1,100 dollars per student)
- Talawanda lowest % of state share in All of Butler County
- Local Capacity (what Talawanda taxpayers pay) is unequitable
- Talawanda has not had a levy in 20 years. Has been fiscally responsible.
- State aide is based on 2022 data and does <u>NOT</u> take into account rising costs

### What Should I address continued?

- Fair School Funding Formula does not help Talawanda; Guarantee is sustaining Talawanda at 2008 levels
- We are a rural and suburban school district with a major university (Miami) within our boundaries
- Miami properties do not pay taxes that go to Talawanda, but raises the surrounding values of property making us appear wealthier
- Over 40% Low Socio-economic (or Poverty); Growing English Language Learning student population
- Talawanda's Report Card is strong
- 4.5 Stars
- Number 1 Ranked high school in Butler County
- Graduation Rate: 98%
- Talawanda Middle School Received Momentum Award (scores increased 3 points or higher)
- Other Information you feel is important


- Testimony in Columbus if Able (How to Testify or Submit Testimonies)
